he North Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching (NCCAT) offers a six-session series focused on research-to-practice exploration of the foundational skills in early literacy. To fully comprehend increasingly complex text, students must have

a strong foundation in the skills of early literacy. These skills-framed by the science of reading and based on the "big ideas" of phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehensionwork together to create proficient readers who are also lifelong learners.

Teachers can attend all six sessions and complete related assignments based on application of new learning to earn an NCCAT Literacy Badge or attend individual sessions to deepen understanding of the building blocks of beginning reading.

Ramsey Regional Activity Center on the campus of Western Carolina University Thursday, April 15, 2021.

The award was presented for the second time with finalists from across the state in attendance.

Higdon was described as a beacon of positivity. Her principal noted: her unrelenting courage to embrace opportunities to help her students grow makes her an ideal example of a leader. A student said her style of communication makes the learning process feel more collaborative. The classroom works together as a group and she hears what each of student has to say.






